

Jain gives the Virgo, a Mercury -influenced decanate of the Earth sign, the Spiritual message: From Every Event of Life the Soul May Extract Value, Even as the Verdant Vine Transforms Indifferent Waters into Rich and Sparkling Wine.

E ach of the twelve primary signs of the zodiac is further subdivided into three ten-degree sections called decanates. The decanates enjoy a primary influence from their mother sign, and a secondary influence from each of the signs that shares the same element as that sign. Hence, the first decanate of the sixth sign, Boötes, is termed *Virgo-Virgo*, as it is found within the primary sign Virgo, and enjoys a secondary influence of the earth sign, Virgo. The Keyword for this decanate is

"Achievement", and it extends from August 23 to September 2 of each year.

As explained above, the decanates are subordinate in their influence to the signs themselves. Similarly, in interpreting and explaining the symbolism of each decanate, they nearly always relate back to their mother sign in terms of their overarching value and meaning. If you will recall, as the sixth sign of the zodiac and as the second earth sign, Virgo archetypi-

Many gardeners will tell you that no matter how much you nurture a plant, of it's not placed in the right spot, it simply won't thrive. For us, a thriving plant means vibrant blooms or an abundance of tomatoes. We assign value to those that offer beauty or nourishment and, with little hesitation, pull and discard those that don't. In essence, we are practicing discrimination—the chief attribute of Virgo .

Sometimes, a plant can stir deep emotions. Take, for example, Stumpy the cherry tree in Washington, D.C.—old and damaged, yet resilient, blooming beautifully despite adversity. Due to repeated flooding of the Tidal Basin caused by climate

change and the sinking of its seawall, the National Park Service initiated a project to restore the area, which included removing several trees, among them Stumpy. As a proud member of the Stumpy fan club, I was dismayed to see it cut down this spring after one final bloom. The Virgo-Virgo decanate is

represented by the constellation Boötes, which Zain calls the "Husbandman in the Sky." In biblical usage, a husbandman is a farmer or cultivator of the soil—one who toils with no guarantee of success. Unpredictable weather or personal neglect can undo our efforts in an instant. But to be good stewards of the land and of whatever we nurture and grow, we must pair knowledge with will .

Though we can't control external forces, we can take measures to mitigate their impact. Whether it's the seed you plant in your garden or the houseplant you bring home, it will flourish with your attention and understanding of its needs. So too will the soul. Growth—of any kind—is an achievement .

from the earth into the grapes swelling on the vine is converted into juice which is suitable for wine."

In an allegorical story from Greek Mythology, Boötes is taken to represent the Athenian Icarius (not to be confused with Icarus), a gardener who once invited Dionysus to visit his vineyards. The god was so impressed with the abundant swelling clusters of grapes that he gave Icarius the secret gift of making wine. Icarius followed the god's instructions and became so successful at it that he had a thought to distribute his product to the masses, in a cart laden with barrels. However, as the people had never tried wine before, and without exercising moderation, they became intoxicated. Upon waking the next day, feeling disoriented and sick, they assumed Icarius had tried to poison them. Without giving Icarius a chance to vindicate himself, they slew him and buried his body under a tree.

Icarius' daughter Erigone searched for his body with the help of her faithful dog Maera. Upon finding it, in grief, she hanged herself from the tree planted there.

Dionysus was angered by his friend's passing and blighted the Athenians with a curse. He was only appeased after a festival was set up in honour of Icarius and his daughter, with dancing and fruits, as would befit the harvest sign Virgo. Dionysus decided to place Icarius among the stars as Boötes, Erigone as the Virgin, and Maera as the Dog Star so that we may learn to respect his divine gifts and remember the fate of Icarius.

Pictured below, the god Dionysus gifts grape and wine to the Athenian Icarius. The god and his Maenad nymph companion Acme are both crowned with wreaths of fruiting grapevines. Not pictured below is the rest of the image that shows Icarius with cart and barrels.

Icarius, because of his devotion and skill in tending to Nature's garden, was blessed by Dionysus with the knowledge of the 'spirit' of the vine, Nature's inner secret to growing grapes, like an initiation into the mysteries. But like Icarius, sometimes we should realize, that not all people are ready, or of a nature to understand, and Nature's secrets are not to be widely disseminated without discretion; they may be distorted or abused by the profane. Sometimes they are intended only for those who have earned them.

We are all vines in our own way, growing in Nature's garden, but some are born to remain as grapes. Even though the wild Dionysian natural yeast, or 'bloom' on grapes, bears its own means of fermentation, not all are born to know the 'spirit' of the vine, that is, to become conscious of Nature's Innermost secrets, and quaff the "mercurial water" of philosophy.

River Phoenix was named after the river of life in Hermann Hesse's book Siddhartha, a poetic novel about a man's spiritual journey during the time of the Buddha.

ith his Sun at 0° Virgo in the 10th house, his soul's path was clearly aligned with achievement and public recognition. He rose to fame with Stand by Me (1986), earned an Academy Award nomination at 18 for Running on Empty (1988), and starred alongside Harrison Ford in Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade (1989). His role in My Own Private Idaho (1991),



especially music and acting. Intellectually curious and self-taught, he was articulate, idealistic, and unusually mature for his age. Tragically, he died at 23 from "acute multiple drug intoxication," a mix of cocaine, morphine, marijuana, Valium, and cold medicine. His death was ruled accidental. Today, he is remembered as a cultural icon—often called Generation X's James Dean.

Exploring River's Chart: A Soul Marked for Achievement and the Question of What Might Have Been

River Phoenix's Sun at 0° Virgo in the 10th house speaks of a soul destined to achieve, with precision, purpose, and a quiet intensity. As a first-decan Virgo, "achievement" defined him: disciplined, morally grounded, and devoted to his craft. His public identity was built on service, integrity, and a commitment to excellence. With Leo on the Midheaven and Mars in Leo, his ambition burned brightly. He wasn't just acting—he was answering a calling. Mars here gave him the courage and drive to command the spotlight, but for River, success meant more than fame. His performances were bold, purposeful, and deeply felt—a testament to his inner fire and unwavering standards.

The square between Sun and Moon reflects the tension between River's Sun in Virgo in the 10th, which sought independence and public recognition, and his Moon in Taurus in the 7th, which craved emotional security and deep connection. This inner conflict often pulled his public and private selves in opposite directions. River likely struggled to balance the pursuit of success with his emotional needs, feeling torn between ambition and love, an unresolved tension that colored his relationships and sense of self.

River's Moon at 29° Taurus in the 7th house, conjunct Saturn at 22°, speaks to a deep need for stable, grounded relationships. The final degree of Taurus suggests a karmic lesson around security and selfworth, while Saturn adds emotional gravity, making River take commitments seriously, sometimes too seriously. He likely longed for unconditional love but struggled with trust, and his emotional life often carried a patient, resigned tone. With Saturn's influence in the 7th house and close range to his Moon, a part of him was always prepared for loss, as reflected in his quote: "I'm having a kind of hard time keeping my head above water in this crazy business."

Mercury and Pluto conjunct at 26° Virgo in the 11th house reveal River's sharp, transformative mind. This placement gave him incredible focus, critical thinking, and a drive to improve systems, particularly in social and collective contexts. River wasn't interested in superficial fame; he aimed to reshape the world through his voice, whether in film or activism, a communicator of transformation. A devout vegetarian from age 8, he condemned the exploitation of animals, advocating for organizations like PETA, Earth Save, and Earth Trust. With five planets in Earth signs, River found peace in nature, feeling most at home outdoors, disconnected from the artificiality of celebrity.

Uranus in Libra in the 11th house fueled River's desire to innovate and challenge traditional norms. It amplified his idealism and drive to connect with causes and groups that reflected his progressive values. Unwilling to conform to Hollywood's machine, he sought out roles in films that broke boundaries. River gravitated toward artistic and social circles that valued authenticity and rebellion, empowering his visionary mind to achieve not just fame but cultural influence.

Adding to his story, Venus in Libra in the 12th house reveals River's quiet, romantic connection to beauty and art, particularly music. "I've been wanting to go into music ever since I can remember. I mean even before I became an actor. I just thought it would be a tough field to break into, so I became an actor instead." Though acting brought him public success, music remained his hidden passion, a personal sanctuary he cherished deeply. "Music is a whole oasis in my head. The creation process is so personal and fulfilling," he said, reflecting on its special place in his life. While acting aligned with his Virgo Sun's theme of achievement, music was the dream he hadn't fully pursued. The sextile from Venus to his Midheaven suggests this private passion subtly enriched his public work, adding emotional depth. Yet, music remained the love he never fully realized, a bittersweet contrast to his purpose-driven life.

With his Scorpio Ascendant at 5°, conjunct Jupiter in the 12th, River exuded a mysterious, soulful aura that made him unforgettable. Scorpio rising made him private, emotionally complex, and deeply intuitive, while Jupiter amplified these traits, giving his persona a larger-than-life quality. Audiences sensed his spiritual and emotional depth, which transcended his age. This magnetic energy made him compelling to both directors and fans. He carried a mythic, almost fated resonance, reflecting his own belief: "I don't want to die in a car accident. When I die,

it'll be a glorious day. It'll probably be a waterfall."

Neptune in Scorpio in the 1st house deeply shaped River Phoenix's identity and presence, enhancing his intuitive sensitivity to emotional undercurrents. This gave him a raw, vulnerable energy in his performances: "You feel the spirit move you. I can be possessed really well." While Neptune fueled his artistic genius, it also blurred the line between reality and illusion, pulling him into the emotional undertow that surrounded him. This placement, connected to his 5th house of creativity (ruled by Pisces), tied his emotional intensity directly to his craft.

Neptune at 28° Scorpio, opposing his Moon at 29° Taurus, reveals River's deep emotional sensitivity, empathy, and spiritual longing. This aspect made him highly attuned to others' feelings, often blurring boundaries and leading to emotional overflow. He could idealize others or neglect his own needs, seeking perfection through art-or escape. The tension between Neptune and the Moon suggests inner confusion, vulnerability, and a susceptibility to substance use as a way to soothe raw emotional pain. "I am confused. I go back and forth about success and wealth and want to take the Devil's bribe and use it for God," he once said, capturing his inner conflict and yearning to serve a higher ideal.

River wasn't careless. He was deeply sensitive, attuned to the mysteries of life but burdened by intense emotions and the gap between his ideals and reality.

"Sometimes I wish I wasn't as conscious as I am. It would be so much easier." For him, drugs were a temporary escape from emotional pain and the weight of expectation. With Venus in the 12th and Neptune in the 1st, he longed for transcendent beauty and love—something rarely found in the harsh world of fame.

River Phoenix's chart reveals a brilliant, emotionally rich, and spiritually attuned soul. He was born to shine, challenge norms, and elevate consciousness. But his openness left him vulnerable to the intensity and rawness of the world around him. His legacy lives not only in his films, but in the emotional truth, compassion, and idealism he embodied. He brought depth and soul to every role, every cause, every connection. His chart remains a map of greatness and a reminder of the cost of being extraordinarily gifted in an unkind world. Even now, he carries a mystique, a haunting sense of what could have been. In his short lifetime. River fulfilled the soul task of the Virgo Decanate–leaving behind a legacy of quiet mastery, heartfelt conviction, and the kind of achievement that transcends time.

"It's a great feeling to think that I can be a friend to so many people through my movies." River Phoenix, reflecting on the impact of touching lives through his art.

Rob Reiner, director of *Stand By Me*, said: "He was a natural. I don' know how to explain it. He just had a presence. He was such a soulful young kid and had that ability to be both tough and vulnerable at the same time."

Gus Van Sant, director of My Own Private Idaho, in an interview with Rolling Stone in 1993, said: "River rewrote some of his own dialogue. He brought so much of himself to the role, and it made the film something I could have never imagined."

Director Peter Weir told the Washington Post in 1986: "I saw in River an extraordinary understanding of his character. His performance was more than acting—it was like he was living inside that role. River was so grounded in his emotions; he helped hold the film together. His quiet strength gave the story its emotional core."

Harrison Ford in a 2019 interview with *Entertainment Weekly:* "I thought River

cally represents the descent of spirit into matter and the principle of reaping as we sow. The allegory that Zain (1997) most completely analyzes in this sense is the story of The Creation of Man and Woman in the Holy Bible as detailed in the earliest chapters of the Book of Genesis (*New International Version, 2025a, Genesis 1-3*). As the tale is told in the Bible itself, this event is shrouded in darkness and negativity, casting Eve as the cause and culprit of the entrance of sin into the world. However, Zain's (1997) explanation is far was an extraordinary actor. He brought a freshness and a depth to that character that really made it come alive for the audience. 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more uplifting, and in particular, casts Eve in a completely different light.

As Zain (1997) explains, in this tale, Adam represents the immortal ego, the limitless potentiality that vivifies and animates all life. In other words, Adam represents the principle of Spirit. On the other hand, Eve represents the material world, the broad and bountiful bosom of Nature that provides a dwelling place for Spirit. In other words, Eve represents the principle of Matter. The serpent, an an-

cient symbol of evil, but also of renewal, transformation, growth, and wisdom, "tempts" Eve into partaking of the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, who then enlists Adam in her cause. Metaphorically, this can be interpreted as Adam, or Spirit, uniting with Eve, or Matter, in order to learn and develop through the gift of life's multiplicitous experiences. Recast in this manner, Eve is converted from the weakwilled source of original sin into a daring, fearless heroine who makes the fundamental transformation from unbearable ignorance to abiding wisdom possible.


Furthermore, as the harvest sign, Virgo reminds us that at all times we are sowing seeds in the fertile soil of our own consciousness. If we sow good seeds, then we shall gather good fruits. In other words, virtuous thoughts, feelings, words, and actions establish the conditions for virtuous experiences. On the other hand, if we sow bad seeds, what else can we expect to reap but sour, distasteful, and disfigured fruits? In other words, vicious thoughts, feelings, words, and actions just as effectively establish the conditions for vicious experiences. For this reason, the Leading Text of Virgo is stated thusly: "If a Man Sows Discordant Thoughts He Will Reap Painful Experiences, But if He Sows Thoughts of Harmony He Will Garner Success and Happiness" (Zain, 1997. p. 137).

In a similar fashion, all three of the decanates found within Virgo elucidate important aspects of these two main messages. The first decanate of Virgo is called Boötes, which Zain (1997, p. 137) translates as "the Husbandman," or as might be rendered more simply in a contemporary context, "the farmer" (Merriam Webster, 2025). The primary tale that Zain (1997) tells in order to expound the moral message of Boötes is found in John 2 (*New International Version*, 2025b, John 2: 1-11). Along with his mother, Mary,

Jesus and his disciples were invited to a wedding at Cana in Galilee. It must have been a lively affair, because at some point, all of the wine was gone. Mary noted this to Jesus, who directed the host's servants to fill six stone vessels with water. Then Jesus told them to draw some of the liquid out and bring it to the master of the banquet. By the time they did so, the water had been transformed into wine. This constituted Jesus's first miracle, and his disciples believed in him.

Similar to Jesus in the allegory above, Boötes, the keeper of the vineyard, cares for and cultivates the magical vines that naturally convert the waters of the earth

into sweet, delectable juice suitable for winemaking. Fascinatingly, grape vines are extremely hardy, capable of surviving under very diverse, often challenging climatic conditions. They are found broadly distributed on every continent with the sole exception of Antarctica. With proper care, they can survive in arid deserts or regions of the Earth's surface that experience cold, harsh winters. They thrive in deep topsoil, tunneling roots up to 20 feet to sidestep competition from

other plants with shallower root systems. Conversely, they do perfectly well on steep, craggy hillsides with just the merest coating of topsoil. In all, grape vines are capable of thriving under an astonishing array of temperature and precipitation variations (Clemens, 2020).

In the same way, the spiritual sower seeks growth and development from all of the experiences of life. They do not protest that spiritual growth can only be achieved under very precise conditions, for example ensconced safely away in a monastery or nunnery. Rather, they recognize that experiences themselves are the seeds of enlightenment, and they seek higher and higher states of consciousness right where they are, no matter the prevailing environmental conditions or cir-



cumstances. The leading text for Boötes is: From Every Event of Life the Soul May Extract Value, Even as the Verdant Vine Transforms Indifferent Waters into Rich and Sparkling Wine (Zain, 1997, p. 141). Simi-

> larly, we as timeless tillers of life's variegated experiences can cultivate a rich and sparkling elixir of life, love, and light when we perceive these events from just the right perspective.

Part 6 - Anubis: The Evolution of Consciousness from Chemical to Simple

Introduction

Recap of Part 5:

(An our last installment (Part 5 of this ${old O}$ series), we demonstrated that Set, the god of war-chaos-disharmony, husband of Nephthys, and brother of Osiris, is the theological "icon" that represents two BOL doctrines. As the murderer who "dismembered" his brother Osiris, he represents the polarization of the energies of the ego that results in the separation of the twin souls from a single soul sphere that occurs in the highest (7th) level of the Spiritual Realm during the Descent Phase of the Cycle of Necessity (CON). Additionally, Set represents the disharmonious energies of the soul that accumulate during its journey through the CON. As Nephthys, shown previously, represents the Descent Phase of the CON during which the separation of the twin souls occurs, it is no coincidence that she is theologically paired, as wife, to Set (a.k.a. "Seth").

Interestingly, if we think of Set and Nephthys in terms of planetary associations, it is easy to recognize that Set, god of war, must be associated with Mars. Likewise, Nephthys, goddess of death, and representing the "descent" (contractive) phase of the CON, which results in the "crystallization" of the soul as it incarnates into the Physical Realm, is clearly associated with Saturn. If we think of the CON in terms of the Law of Polarity, the Descent Phase would be its "negative" side, and the Ascent Phase would be its "positive" side. So, again, we find it no coincidence that the two malefics, Set (Mars) and Nephthys (Saturn), are theologically paired on the Descent (negative) Phase of the CON.

In this installment, we will follow the twin souls, through the CON as they incarnate into the Physical Realm. Although we consider incarnation into the Physical Realm, at the initial mineral level, to be the beginning of the Ascent Phase of the CON, we must acknowledge, with Zain, that the soul's (Continued on page 14)

Chemical Consciousness

Their chemical changes are not fortuitous, but governed by the same broad law that determines the alliances between members of the human race. Man is drawn to certain companions, and repelled from others. The atoms of matter exhibit similar preferences."

experience in the Physical Realm, even up to its last incarnation into the human level, still represents the "bottom" of the CON - or as he puts it, "the cellar of a vast skyscraper" that is the Ascent Phase of the CON. Yet, it is within this "cellar" of the Physical Realm, as it transmigrates from the mineral through the animal level, to finally incarnate in human form, that the soul begins its ascent by means of the evolution of its consciousness. We shall see that Anubis, god of mummification, and son of Nephthys and Osiris, represents the BOL teaching regarding the evolution of consciousness from the mineral (chemical consciousness) to animal (simple consciousness) level.

To supplement this discussion, the reader is encouraged to read or revisit Parts I – V of this series [2, 3, 4, 5, 6], as well as read Chapter 5, ("Higher Consciousness") in Course 3 (Spiritual Alchemy) by CC Zain [7].

Anubis: Offspring of Nephthys and Osiris

To begin, let us address this question, "Why did Set want to kill his brother Osiris?" The answer to this was mentioned in Part 3 of the present series, "The Osiris Myth." It was said, in one important version of the story, that although Nephthys was married to Set, she, nevertheless, was in love with Osiris. Furthermore, Nephthys and Isis were "twin" sisters, and their appearance was identical in all respects except in their clothing. So, one night, Nephthys dressed up as her sister Isis and tricked Osiris into spending a night together. The result of this was her offspring Anubis. It is the discovery of this "affair" that is Set's motive for killing Osiris. After giving birth to Anubis, Nephthys could not keep the child. Instead, it is said that Isis took Anubis and raised it as her own.

Let us now examine this theological story for its underlying doctrines. First, why is Nephthys said to be "in love with Osiris?" Remembering that Osiris represents the twin souls, and that the first part of their

It can certainly be said metaphorically that the Descent Phase of the CON (Nephthys) is "in love" with and "cares for" the twin souls (Osiris) as they descend through the various levels and Realms.

Next, why is it that Nephthys and Isis are said to be "twin sisters?" Remembering that both Nephthys and Isis represent the CON, and that the CON is comprised of two ("twin") phases, we can now understand. The Descent Phase, represented by Nephthys, is certainly the mirror-image of the Ascent Phase, represented by Isis. In a meta-

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phorical sense, these two phases are "twin sisters," identical in appearance (involving the same levels and Realms), but different in function.

Now, we come to the birth of Anubis and his adoption and raising by Isis. What is the end result of the twin souls (Osiris) "interaction" with the Descent Phase of the CON (Nephthys)? The result is "birth" into the Physical Realm and the evolution of consciousness through the mineral, plant, and animal levels before the human level is reached. So, "Nephthys" (i.e., the Descent Phase of the CON) does indeed give "birth," metaphorically, to "Anubis" (i.e., the twin souls) as they incarnate into the Physical Realm.

Finally, why does Isis adopt Anubis and raise him as "her own son?" This is an odd reaction. In human terms, given that she was betrayed by her sister who had an affair with her husband and then had his child, the last thing one would expect is for Isis to adopt, care for, and raise Anubis. Yet, she does so. Why? Again, we turn to the underlying theological meaning that explains this odd twist to the story. It is indeed true that the Descent Phase gives "birth" to the twin souls as they incarnate into the Physical Realm at the mineral level. But, from this point on, it is not the Descent Phase, "Nephthys," that takes care of the separated twin souls; they are now in the Ascent Phase, represented by Isis. So, in a metaphorical sense, "Isis" (the Ascent Phase) "adopts" the separated twin souls and takes care of them, raising them as her own, nurturing the evolution of their consciousness as they now ascend through the mineral, vegetable, and animal levels of the Physical Realm. This evolution of consciousness (from chemical to simple consciousness)

through these levels is what Anubis represents theologically as we shall see.

Anubis: The God of Mummification

So far, our BOL theology seems to have strong explanatory power that allows one to make sense of the stories of the Osiris Myth. It explains well the story of Nephthys' affair with Osiris, the birth of Anubis, and even Anubis' adoption by Isis. However, how can we be confident that Anubis represents the BOL teaching regarding the evolution of consciousness, from chemical to simple consciousness, as the soul ascends from the mineral through animal levels of the Physical Realm? The answer to this lies in a number of further "coincidences" having to do with Anubis.

Anubis is the god of mummification. This, in itself, is quite telling. One could say incarnation into the Physical Realm itself is a type of "mummification." As the soul incarnates into the Physical Realm for the first time, it "crystalizes," which can be considered a form of "death." As it does so, it takes on the "outer wrapping" of a physical body – in this case, a simple crystal. So, in a poetic sense at least, the soul has become "mummified." However, let's look closer at Anubis and the process of Egyptian mummification itself.

There are a number of steps in the process of mummification. However, several important steps are key to our understanding of Anubis theologically. When a body was prepared for mummification, and after the first step of purification and the removal of most internal organs (except the heart), the next key step was to dehydrate the body by covering it with Natron – a type of salt or "mineral." It is not just the dehydration effect that is important here. The covering of the body with Natron

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itself has a theological meaning. It represents the soul's journey and evolution of consciousness through the mineral level of the Physical Realm (see Fig. 1).

The next step in the mummification process involved stuffing the body with straw or other vegetable matter in order for it to retain its shape and then wrapping the body with strips of linen. This linen was made from the fibers of the flax plant. Resin from trees, mixed with other plant oils and extracts, was used to "glue" the wraps in place. Again, here we have, not only a practical process, but one with theological meaning. These steps, involving plant materials, represent the soul's journey and evolution of consciousness through the plant level of the Physical Realm (see Fig. 2).

Presiding over the embalming process was a priest who wore an Anubis mask. Why? The god Anubis is depicted with the body of a man with the head of a jackal. Unlike a hawk who can soar into the "heavens," the jackal is an earth-bound animal. This depiction of Anubis, by the priest presiding over the embalming process, represents the soul's journey and evolution of consciousness through the animal level of the Physical Realm (see Figs. 1 & 2).

According to the BOL teachings, the soul's journey through the mineral, plant, and animal levels of the Physical Realm corresponds to the evolution of chemical, vegetative, psychic, and simple consciousness. These forms of consciousness are developed and are characteristic of the impersonal soul at the animal level. It is this BOL teaching that has been encoded, and thus safe-guarded, in the theological story of Anubis, the god of mummification. There are other BOL theological teachings encoded in other roles of Anubis and in the mummification process. However, these are beyond the scope of our present focus.

In the next installment of this series, we shall examine Isis and the birth of her son Horus, who represents the evolution of rational, cosmic, and divine consciousness that ultimately reunites the twin souls and takes them from the human level of selfconsciousness, out of the "cellar" of the Physical Realm, to ascend to the higher levels of the "vast skyscraper," that is the Ascent Phase of the CON.

attraction and repulsion felt by atoms induces them to join in the formation of molecules. Then a colony of molecules may combine in a particular way to form the body through which an impersonal soul that has graduated from the stages of atomic consciousness can express itself. Such a colony dominated by a sovereign intelligence is called a crystal."
