Astrology—Taurus

aurus is the second sign of the zodiac and was pictured by the ancients as the head and front quarters of a bull. The constellation of Taurus can be best viewed in the winter sky of the northern hemisphere bordered by the constellations of Aries, Gemini, Auriga, Perseus, Orion, and Eridanus. Aldebaran, Arabic for "follower," is the brightest star in the constellation. This star can be found fol-

lowing the Pleiades through the night sky. The Sun enters the tropical sign of Taurus approximately 30 days after the spring equinox. The sidereal constellation of Taurus has shifted about 23 degrees from the tropical position due to the precession of the equinoxes.

Throughout the ancient world the sacred bull was worshiped as a fertility sym-

bol. The ancient Egyptians had the sacred bull Apis with his sanctuary at Memphis. Early Minoan frescos depicted bull-leaping ceremonies, and Greek mythology

held awe of the Minotaur, or Bull of Minos. The Hindu god Shiva is frequently pictured riding on the back of the sacred bull, Nandi. Mithraism, an ancient mystery school that was contemporary with early Christianity, featured the tauroctony or ritual slaying of the bull. This is a central theme in the subterranean sanctuaries that are distributed throughout the former boundaries of the Roman Empire. In the tauroctony, the constellation of Perseus is pictured in the heavens above Taurus holding a sword representing Mithras as the bull-slayer. The modern sport of bullfighting found throughout Spain, Portugal, and most of Latin America could very well have its origins in these ancient bull ceremonies. Bull riding, a common feature today at any rodeo in the western United States, may also be related to these more ancient rituals.

Cattle were first domesticated around 9,000 years ago during the Neolithic, or New Stone Age. They have been used for draft animals, sport, and portable wealth in the form of meat, milk, and hides. It seems fitting, therefore, that when the ancients chose a symbol to place in the heavens to represent wealth, they chose Bos Taurus, the domesticated cow. Our word cattle is derived from the Latin caput, meaning head, referring to a head or unit of livestock. The word chattel, any unit of property, and capital (property put up for investment) share the same etymological origins as cattle. It was not so long ago that women and slaves were referred to as chattel or the property of men. To this day the Maasai, a tribal people of East Africa, continue to measure their wealth in cattle. It is not uncommon for a man to provide a dowry gift of cattle as the purchase price for a bride.

Perhaps the most celebrated bull in classical mythology is the bull that abducted Europa. Zeus, enamored by Europa, a high-born Phoenician, set about to seduce her. He transformed himself into a pure white bull and moved undetected among her father's herds. Enchanted by the perfect beast, Europa mounted the bull, who then dove into the sea and swam to the shores of Crete. Zeus later placed the

Numbers as Archetypes: The Eternal Monad

The Ancient Greeks called the first quantity the Monad. The word *monad* derives from "menien", meaning "to be stable", implying the Greeks' belief that the Monad well represented the first and eternal principle of all things. As such, it alternatively represented God, Spirit, Eternity, and all other concepts beyond space and time, which bore no beginning or end.

Recalling from the introductory article on this topic that the ancient mathematical philosophers understood numbers not only as quantities, but as geometrical figures, the seminal shape associated with the Monad is the Circle. The Circle is well representative of the principles of the Monad, in that it also is unchanging and stable, totally uniform on all "sides", and has no beginning or end. As such, it has been used since time immemorial as symbolic of the same principles as the Monad. Consider as an example its use as a wedding band, to indicate the hope that a marriage should be deeply enduring.

Hence, when speaking of the Monad, it is equally effective to discuss the important symbolic aspects of a Circle, as it represents spatially what the Monad represents quantifiably. Indeed, Brotherhood of Light members are already deeply familiar with this symbol, as it is the same as the astrological symbol for the Sun. It is a *central point* set within a *space* marked out by a *perfectly uniform circle*. Let us discuss each of these critical parts of the symbol in turn.

The point at the center represents the concept of the Monad as a beginning. It is the seed from which all things come. In this sense, then, it represents well that motivating Force of the Universe which in various cultures has been called God, YHWH, or Brahma—among countless other titles. A true point is dimensionless, representing a state of existence beyond space and time.

That point expands outward equally and uniformly in all directions to simultaneously create the boundary of the Circle (represented in Western traditions by the Dyad) and the space which that boundary demarcates (represented in Western traditions by the Triad). The Circle, then, represents a Great Mystery: the Unity manifest as a Trinity. It can also be taken to express the journey from nothingness (represented by the point), to everything (represented by a circle with an infinite number of

points on its surface), and all developmental stages in between.

The Monad also bears some very interesting arithmetic and geometric properties. IIIIIIIII x IIIIIIIII = 12345678987654321, indicating the all-encompassing role of the Monad in number. Geometrically, the circle represents the single-most efficient two-dimensional shape in the universe. There is no other shape which encloses a greater amount of space within a smaller perimeter. Hence, it also represents maximized efficiency.

This latter principle is borne out in several common examples. Ancient soldiers carried round shields because it allowed them the greatest protection for the least weight and material. Foods are sold most commonly in cylindrical cans because this shape allows the greatest amount of product to be contained in the smallest amount of space and material. The only more efficient three-dimensional shape is a sphere, but it might prove difficult to stack spherical cans!

Hence, we discover in the Monad, and its corresponding shape, the Circle, an undying symbol of the eternal, the unchanging, and the perfectly equal. This, then, entitles it to represent, however imperfectly, that most effluent, unknowable, and incomprehensible Source of all: God. The Monad not only symbolizes the beginning of any process, but also hints at its completion through its mysterious communication of a trinity within a unity. It describes a universe based on efficiency and balance. To Pythagoras and many of the other ancient mathematical philosophers, it was considered the perfect shape. Detailing its hallmarks and traits, it is not at all difficult to see why.

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Dominant Taurus Personality—Liberace

"Don't wear one ring, wear five or six. People ask how I can play with all those rings, and I reply, Very well, thank you." – Liberace (1919 – 1987)

Wladziu Valentino Liberace, the flamboyant American pianist, and entertainer was born in West Allis, Wisconsin, at 11:15 p.m. on May 16, 1919. His twin brother died at birth, and Liberace, born with a caul, was believed by some to be destined for greatness. He was raised in a musical family; his Italian father played French horn and his mother, of Polish ancestry, played some piano. A prodigy at an early age, Liberace learned to memorize difficult musical passages by the time he was seven.

Adopting the stage name "Walter Busterkeys," young Liberace made a living during the Great Depression playing at cabarets, dance lessons, strip clubs, and weddings. In 1940, he attracted favorable reviews playing with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra. By the mid 1940's, he had abandoned the classical concertgoer and was amusing audiences with "classical music with the boring parts left out." He transformed into an entertainer with gaudy costumes, a signature candelabra, and greater audience interaction.

In 1947, Liberace moved to the Los Angeles suburb of North Hollywood and began playing at Hollywood night-

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


Liberace, Wladziu Valentino May 16, 1919, - 11:15 P.M. West Allis, Wisconsin

clubs. With the modesty typical of a dominant Sun personality, he was billing himself as "Liberace—the most amazing piano virtuoso of the present day." By 1948, he was performing at the Last Frontier: one of only two hotels in in Las Vegas, the little town that would eventually be known as Sin City and the source of Liberace's sizeable fan-base.

1950 was to be a stellar year for Liberace; he made his film debut in the role of a piano player in *South Sea Sinner* with Shelley Winters and was invited by President Truman to play in the East room of the White House. That same year, while performing at a club in San Diego, he was discovered by a TV producer who launched a television career

that would eventually win him two Emmys and make Liberace a household name. By 1955 he was the highest paid entertainer in Las Vegas history.

Liberace had a powerful conjunction of the Sun and Mars in Taurus bestowing a vital and charismatic stage presence. Liberace's Sun/Mars conjunction was in his 4th House, which made him passionate about real estate. In fact, he collected homes, with one in Malibu, the Hollywood Hills, Las Vegas, Lake Tahoe, and Palm Springs. Liberace had a flair for interior design, and in 1966 he opened Liberace Interiors and Objects d'Art in Hollywood, California, offering his design services to wealthy patrons.

The keyword for Taurus is "I Have," and over the years, Liberace was alternately referred to as The Glitter Man, Mr. Showmanship, and the King of Bling. True

to Taurus nature, he adored all the trappings of wealth; extravagant costumes, fabulous jewelry, custom pianos, and classic cars. He assembled his collections in the Liberace Museum near Las Vegas, which opened April 1979 and functioned as the fundraising arm of the Liberace Foundation for the Performing and Creative Arts, which funds scholarships for schools and colleges across the nation. The museum closed October 17, 2010.

Although Liberace fervently denied his homosexuality, in 1982 he was sued in a palimony case by Scott Thorson, his 24-year-old, live-in companion and chauffer, who claimed he had been promised \$70,000 income for life. On February 4, 1987, Liberace died from complication due to AIDS in his Palm Springs, California home known as The Cloisters.

mythic bull in the heavens, portraying only the front legs and head, the portion that would have been visible above the surface of the sea.

In the Near-Eastern world, Taurus was associated with the goddess Inanna, or Ishtar, patroness of love, fertility, and plenty. Her equivalent in the Greco-Roman world was Aphrodite or Venus. In astrological description we say that Venus rules, or is at home, in the sign of Taurus because they share the intrinsic qualities of beauty, sensuality, and wealth.

Taurus, along with the signs of Virgo and Capricorn, comes under the dominion of the feminine element earth, which all three signs share as expressions of pragmatism and practicality. Like Leo, Scorpio, and Aquarius, Taurus is a fixed sign, representing its element in the densest or most perfected form. Due to this fixity, Taurus persons are perfectionist and can frequently be rigid and unyielding in their attitudes. As fixed earth, Taurus is the zodiacal sign most deeply steeped in matter, and its natives are always working towards goals with measurable results. Much like the ox used to plow ancient fields, Taurus per-

sons move slowly and steadily towards the accomplishment of their objectives. They are steadfast and reliable, which gives rise to their best quality of stability; and like the bull, who once he lays down is unlikely to move, Taurus exhibits a stubbornness that is summarized as its worst quality, obstinacy. Although the bull is the male of the cow species, Taurus as an earth sign is considered to be feminine. The fecund earth has long been seen as the symbol of fertility and wealth, bringing forth an abundance of crops. The month of May, where the Sun passes through Taurus during the first three weeks, has long been dedicated to fertility and the feminine divine.

The key phrase for Taurus is "I Have," and astrologers hold that those persons born at this time of year exhibit possessiveness and share a greater concern for the acquisition of tangible wealth. In an astrological chart, Taurus is the natural ruler of the second house, which represents our relationship to wealth, money, finance, personal possessions, and values.

In the symbolic language of astrological shorthand, the glyph for Taurus is pictured as the head of the bull.


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
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

and without being judgmental, some of the people of our own time who seemed to be trapped by the glitter of the material world. By the same token, consider Oprah Winfrey, Bill and Melinda Gates, Bono, and other philanthropists who are using their wealth to improve the lives of others. Using our material means to be of assistance to others "...opens the avenues to spiritual attainment." (Spiritual Astrology, p. 48) There is no gift to humanity which is too small.

The key to our wealth is to uncover our natural abilities as designated by our birth charts. This gives us the opportunity to advance ourselves so that we may be of more benefit to others. We can give time, we can give things, and we can give money, our healing abilities, and our creativity. All of these may be used for spiritual advantage.

What of the inner meanings of Taurus? What do we do with the spiritual energy we engender by our good works and how may we transmute our energies into the finer essences with which we may really impact the inner realms and build our spiritual bodies?

Taurus expresses in the spiritual world as the perpetual movement of life; thus, we must act unceasingly. Taurus expresses in the intellectual world as the combinations of ideas which create the moral life; thus, we must think morally unceasingly. Taurus expresses in the physical world as the combination of the forces of nature; thus, we must combine our thoughts and our actions to impact the physical world by contributing to Universal Welfare. This is the "...combination and interchange of masculine and feminine forces throughout nature, working ceaselessly in all kingdoms as the instigators and cause of all movements and life." (*The Sacred Tarot, p.*189) Ahhhhhh, sex.

Taurus represents perfect union on the inner plane in which all the finer forces, alchemically balanced, are completely blended and fused. This is the exchange of the finer masculine and feminine energies which are controlled and directed by love. Ahhhhh, sex.

Zain tells us that "love manifests on all planes and in various degrees of grossness and refinements; for it is convertible...and in truth,...it lies at the foundation of all activity, all intelligence, and all feeling." (The Sacred Tarot, p.192) We each have to find an inner balance of masculine and feminine energies as shown by the sun and moon in our personal horoscopes. It would seem nearly impossible for us to try and work on balancing a relationship with anyone else without first balancing the energies present within our own selves. Treating ourselves with harmony,

dignity, kindness, and caring must come naturally before we can hope to treat our partners in this same way.

It is important for us to understand that the key to spiritual growth comes from blending our spiritual natures with the spiritual natures of those we love. I remember when I was young having such strong sexual feelings and thinking that I had to act on them all. It took some time before I realized that elevating those feelings to a higher place, and not acting physically brought me so much more love and so much closer to Spirit. This is the regenerate love as represented by Taurus; it is a blend and an exchange of the finer forces of life. It is a "...beautiful ecstatic union between two who are devoted to each other, and who feel the most tender toward each other." (The Sacred Tarot, p. 192-3) By fusing forces with another who is also working on the Divine Plan, we learn more about harmony, sympathy, and the advancement of all. All our desires and passions can be transmuted into these sorts of energies which can be used for the great expression of Universal Welfare.

Please do not misunderstand; I am not advocating the elimination of physical sex from our lives. It is important that if we have the opportunity to engage in sexual activity with one we love; sex that is full of loving harmony and tender sympathy is really good for us. This sort of sexual activity helps us to maintain a constant exchange of finer energies in our lives. I just want to remind us all that it is possible for us to exchange these energies with others as well, even though this does not occur physically. The mental or spiritual orgasm may not be as physically thrilling to our physical body, but there is definitely something positive to be said for the union of mind and spirit for the Universal Welfare by using a pure form of loving energy when in union with someone whose goals and objectives we share. We must work like the bull represented in this constellation, unceasingly, consistently, tirelessly, for those results that we know will bring us all along together in our growth of spirit.

The Querent asked the following question: "Will our Congressman be re-elected to The House of Representatives?"











Tarot Spread Interpretation

Card Spread

The distant past—The Seven of Coins. Money earned through a journey.

The recent past—Arcanum XIV, The Alchemist. Regeneration or Temperance.

The present— Arcanum X, The Wheel. A change of fortune.

The near future—The Youth of Swords, reversed. A woman of Capricorn temperament.

The distant future—The Eight of Coins reversed. A costly lawsuit.

Summary

The Querent, who was wondering if his representative would be re-elected to his congressional seat, asked this question on the day of the November 2nd elections.

The Yes or No spread is comprised of five cards laid out from left to right. Cards I and 2 represent the past of the matter, the center card represents the present, and cards 4 and 5 symbolize the future. Right-side-up cards represent a yes answer, and reversed cards no. Each card is worth the value of one point for yes or no, with the exception of the center card, which has the value of two

points. In this spread, three of the cards were right side up including the center card, indicating a yes answer.

The Seven of Coins in the distant past reveals that the Congressman had spent a lot of time the previous two years travelling to and from Washington, D.C. This might also possibly denote that campaign and advertising funds were attracted from out of state. The Alchemist, in the position signifying the recent past, indicates perseverance on the campaign trail and the Representative's dedication to environmental causes. The center card, Arcanum X -The Wheel, promises a change of fortune or possible reversal of political party. The near future, signified by The Youth of Swords reversed, normally represents a woman of Capricorn temperament, or perhaps shows the shift in party control in the House of Representatives. The final card, the Eight of Coins reversed, is usually interpreted as a costly lawsuit. One might suspect that the failing economy becomes the Congressman's focus during his next term in office.


New Schedule for Ninth House Mailings

Installing the Horoscope Program for Mac Users

For all you Mac users out there who would like to use the Horoscope Program, here's how you do it:

- If you do not already have a version of Windows on your Mac, you will need to purchase a copy of Windows 7 Home Premium. (If you already have it on your Mac, Windows XP or Vista will work just as well.) You can search the web for the best price. Amazon.com sells Windows 7 Premium for around \$170.
- Your Mac has a built in program called Boot Camp that allows you to boot up your Mac in Windows if it is installed. Windows 7 requires Mac OS X v10.6 Snow Leopard and the Boot Camp 3.1 Update.
- You can find instructions for installing Windows 7 at "support.apple.com/kb/ HT3986" or just Google "boot camp windows 7".
- After you have installed Windows 7, restart you Mac in Windows and install the Horoscope Program. That's it.

The problem with Boot Camp is that you have to re-boot your Mac to run Windows programs; so a better alternative is to install one of two available Mac programs that allow you to switch between Mac OS and Windows seamlessly without restarting your Mac: Parallels Desktop 6 for Mac or VMWare Fusion 3 for Mac. Both work exceptionally well and will allow you to easily run most Windows programs. You can search the web for the best price, but they cost around \$80. Once one of these is installed on your Mac, you can install Windows and then install the Horoscope program.
