



We love stories. As human beings we are hard wired for stories. Ancient civilizations taught about their morals and their cultures through their stories. Chapter 1 tells all about this; I hope you read it. Stories hold our attention. Stories teach us, entertain us, amuse us, scare us, and put us in touch with our feelings in a way that is universal to every human on this planet. When we make a new friend, as we connect with others, we share our stories. What makes a book, a film, a work of art, or a song our favorite? It tells a story that touches us in an intimate way.

The knowledge that we have gained through our contact with the Hermetic Brotherhood has come to us through stories, pictures, glyphs, all of which are ancient in origin. Why have we, or better yet, why have you accepted this challenge? It is not for the faint of heart. This involves years of study, memorization, dedication, and challenges that are beyond imagining for each of us. Why? I can only speak for myself, so let me tell you a story.

This system allows me to be an imperfect person who will never be perfect. My chart absolutely shows me where the work is, and how I may proceed. In my early years with the CoL, I placed identifying book plates in each of the precious black text books Forrest and I purchased, little knowing that these words would come to be the mantra for



return to an investigation and analysis of some of the most meaningful and ponderous expressions of our own tradition, as are clearly evinced in Course 7: Spiritual Astrology.

Astrology is a field in flux and controversy. Nowadays, it appears there are as many methods to practice astrology as there are practitioners. Some employ only the inner planets, while others include the outer planets as well. Some elect for an analysis of planets within signs only, while others consider the placement of planets in both signs and houses. Some astrologers opt for a Tropical Zodiac, while others insist that

only the Sidereal Zodiac is legitimate. Regrettably, few scientific studies exist to defend any one particular method of astrological practice over another. We in the *Brotherhood of Light* have our own methods which we swear by, but a Jyotish astrologer would swear equally as fervently that theirs is the correct method. In short, it is often unclear which astrological methods are most effective, and nearly impossible to discover those that are authentically research-based.

Regardless of this controversy, however, there is a point and purpose to Astrolo-

gy that no critic can corrupt. There is a meaning and value to its practice that allows it to persist through not only centuries, but millennia. There is an aspect of this ancient art that keeps people coming back, generation after generation, to sip at the astrological fount of wisdom.

Hidden within the confusion and chaos that abounds in contemporary astrological practice are subtle ores of inestimable value. As the ancient alchemist sought to separate the dross from the pure metal, so too can the contemporary astrologer rest easy in the knowledge that hidden behind the veil of multitudinous astrological practices, a great treasure trove of ancient wisdom awaits. The purpose and function of Course 7: Spiritual Astrology is to open this treasure chest and share its boundless wealth with all those with the ears to hear its arcane teachings.

Ancient man's conception of the world was as different from our own as day is from night. The Ancient Greeks, for example, reasoned that only that which is unchanging and uncorrupted by physical forces could ever be called "real." As such, they conceived of reality as the spiritual world beyond our own physical condition, the latter being at best a murky reflection of the spiritual Reality, and at worst, a veil meant to beguile and snare us in the world of the senses.

Contrast that with the contemporary scientific definition of "real." To the average contemporary scientist, only that which can be observed with the physical senses is said to be real, while conceptions such as God, Heaven, and Hell are

ridiculed as stories told to children and feeble-minded adults to placate and soothe their existential angst. Verily, the conception of the universe of ancient man is as distinct from our own as the penetrating light of the sun is from the dim, unrecognizable shadows cast by the moon.

Perhaps sensing a rising trend in materialism, or perhaps simply wanting as indelibly as possible to insulate their profound spiritual legacy from the ravages of time and ignorance, ancient philosophers sought out objects and phenomena of permanency to represent their spiritual precepts. The ancient sages looked to the Heavens with their concerns, and found fixed in their gaze their hope and solution.

Of all the objects in the physical universe, stars are among the most permanent. Modern science confirms that even stars have "life cycles", as it were, however, with our own sun projected to endure approximately 10 billion years, we are in no danger of it dying out anytime soon. The ancients embedded their spiritual philosophies in those phenomena that they perceived as being most permanent, sketching their spiritual philosophies into the stars themselves.

The sages of old imagined pictographs in the heavens, and imbued those pictographs with meaning and value. These ancient pictographs, i.e., the constellations, were created according to a scheme as logical and coherent as any mathematic formula. Sitting at the zenith of the sun's annual cycle, as if upon their thrones, sat the king, Sun, and his queen, Moon. These are the signs of Leo and Cancer, respectively. Wanting their

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trusty messenger at the ready, Mercury ruled the next two signs out, Virgo and Gemini, respectively. The maiden of the gods, Venus, ruled the next two signs, Libra and Taurus. Requiring the services of a warrior if their court was to have any hope of survival and self-defense, the next two signs, Scorpio and Aries, were ruled by Mars. Kings and queens require ready and ongoing counsel, and King Sun and Queen Moon relied on sagacious Jupiter to provide it. He rules over

the next two signs, namely Sagittarius and Pisces. Finally, in order to address the material and physical needs of their subjects, the king and queen relied on Saturn, ruler of the final two signs, Capricorn and Aquarius. Hence, those with perception will recognize that zodiacal symbolism is actually constructed as a hierarchy originating at the summer solstice. Additionally, if the reader will reflect upon the order of the celestial bodies so reckoned (that is, Sun, Moon, Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn), she will realize that

this is the same order of the inner planets according to their spatial relationships within our solar system.

While we sensibly render the astrological new year with the coincidence of spring, the season of new life and renewed vitality, the zodiac itself appears to be constructed based on the period of the sun's greatest strength- the king upon his throne, if you will. The sun in his annual route achieves his greatest strength at the Summer Solstice, when the days are longest and the nights shortest. Once this point is past, he fatigues a little each day, until in the darkest ebb of his movements, at the Winter Solstice, his vitality is at an all-time low, and he undergoes a metaphoric death. The days are feebly short, while the cold, harsh winter nights seem to endure forever. Fortunately for us, the sun does not remain in the tomb forever, but is joyously reborn. The manacles of death are cast off, and the sun is born anew, each day increasing in vitality and strength, until such time as the cycle repeats itself. The ancients saw in the cycle of the Sun a metaphor for life itself, whether that observation be limited to the 24-hour day (sunrise, noon, sunset, midnight) or the 365 day year (vernal equinox, summer solstice, autumnal equinox, winter solstice).

The ancient sages, wanting to embed their spiritual teachings and philosophies into the most permanent structures within the visible universe, created the constellations of the zodiac according to the scheme explained above. To further elaborate the values and meanings of each of these signs, they developed myths to help wise men and lay people alike to more greatly appreciate the universal themes depicted in these timeless tales of the human condition. To add greater detail and clarity to these 12 primary myths, each sign was further subdivided into 3 sections of 10 zodiacal degrees each, termed decanates. And just as a myth was devised to deliver the main symbolism of each of the 12 primary zodiacal constellations, a myth was also generated to explain the spiritual import of each of the 36 decanatal constellations. The function of Course 7: Spiritual Astrology is nothing other than to deliver and interpret these 48 sagas of spiritual wisdom. As is befitting of such a vast trove of thoughtfulness and consideration, this reservoir is meant to be dynamic rather than static, to be carefully and thoughtfully considered anew by each rising generation.

It is with great enthusiasm and excitement that I look forward to the honor of taking this journey through the 12 zodiacal and 36 decanatal signs with you. Together, we will explore the stories and mythological intentions of some of the most profoundly thoughtful humans ever to set foot upon our planet. Together, we will endeavor to respect tradition while also seeking to intelligently and responsibly apply the wisdom handed down through that tradition to an everchanging contemporary landscape.


Constellation: Canis Minor, The Little Dog

The story of Old Dog Tray reminds us of the risks of "going along to get along" for the sake of security and a sense of belonging. Cancers are nurturing people, quick to respond to the needs of others. They are deeply motivated to establish a sense of home and security. The spiritual message of this decanate offers a caution about the risk to the natives whose desire to establish a sense of belonging and safety may tempt them to go against their own inner nature or better instincts. It is this self betrayal, or "going against one's Divine nature" that may be considered a sin. Losing faith with oneself leads to a feeling of separation and loss of meaning or purpose.

Lynne Palmer Astrologer to the Stars

Palmer could have enjoyed a career as a dancer, and she was asked whether or not she ever regretted giving up dance for astrology, and the answer was, "No."

There was a time when Palmer was rather shy. Between dances, Palmer needed to mingle with customers in El Paso, Texas. She needed a topic for conversation, and she had been reading astrology magazines that Carolynne Snowden had laying around the house. Therefore, Palmer decided a good way to start a conversation would be to talk to the customers about their astrological signs. Hearing Palmer speak with patrons of the dance hall, Snowden thought that Palmer must have a great interest in astrology.



Snowden was quite the taskmaster when it came to working out Palmer for dancing. Palmer was rehearsing every day and performing one hour of hand exercises that included proper use of hands while dancing, one hour of splits, back bends and putting her leg to her head, plus one hour of actual dancing that was choreographed.

Palmer asked Snowden, "How can I be an astrologer?" (even though she really did not care). Snowden called The Church of Light, asked how much it cost, and drug Lynne to astrology classes. After the first math class, Palmer told Snowden that she was not interested in astrology because it was too complicated. That was a Monday night. Snowden said, "It must be the teacher. We will go Wednesday night to another teacher." After that class, Snowden went to the desk and asked, "What books does she need?"

Palmer whispered into Snowden's ear, "Do not buy me any books because I will not read them." Snowden bought the books. She read them to Lynne and commented, "Oh, this is so interesting." Palmer did not answer. On Friday, Snowden said, "We will go to another class. This class is on interpretation."

Palmer found that she could study astrology for eight hours a day while she did not like to rehearse dancing for even one hour. This initial conversation with Doane took place in May. By August, Doane informed Palmer that she had made new class schedules and had put her down as a teacher. Palmer was shocked and said, "I can't teach astrology! What do you have me teaching?" Doane responded, "Beginner's Math Class." Doane insisted that she would learn while she teaches. That was how Palmer got pushed into learning astrology. Now she pushes her clients to get with it.

Another secret to her success is that she is there for her clients. People want answers right away. They do not want to wait weeks to get their charts done. When she lived in New York City, she worked 18 hours a day for many years. Palmer was not all work and no play. If she spent time socializing, she would make up for it by coming home and working.

Palmer was not nervous during her *Tonight Show* appearance. She said that it felt like being in someone's home and talking to them. Palmer commented that she was more nervous giving a lecture than being on *The Tonight Show*.

Over the years, Palmer had quite a few celebrities as clients. Two of her favorites were Mickey Rooney and Ruth Brown, the legendary singer who is in the R and B Hall of Fame. She did their charts almost daily. Ruth Brown listened

to her, and Mickey Rooney did not take her advice all the time.

Even though she is the author of many books, made an appearance on The Tonight Show, and enjoyed a 62-year-long career as an astrologer, it was not till 2018 that she considered herself a celebrity.

On her lynnepalmer.com website she states, "I have been an astrologer since 1957 and have done the horoscopes of many celebrities. In all of those years, I never thought of myself as a celebrity but, after two Gary Williams books, I started thinking about the past activities that may have led me to be called a celebrity such as: walking the Red Carpet, the television shows, the books of other authors that I am in (notably Helen Hayes and Anita Loos book, "Twice Over Lightly," and "Miss Rhythm: The Autobiography of Ruth Brown, Rhythm and Blues Legend." Also "The Life of Jacquelyn Susann by Barbara Seaman (with photo of me with Joe E. Lewis and the forecast by me of Jacquelyn Susann's horoscope)."

When Lynne Palmer met Doris Chase Doane, the event was historic because it was the meeting of two astrological giants. These two ladies are responsible for writing more than 20 books.




