The Sacred Hebrew Alphabet: Yod—Multiplicity as Unity

Scenza

The tenth letter of the Alefbayt (AB), Yod, is the smallest of all the letters, indicating that as with the Monad, it is a seed of things to come. It is also the only letter that hangs suspended above the line in a new plane of action and behavior, indicating its position as the starting point for a movement beyond the original archetypes represented by the nine single digits. Perhaps the simplest way to penetrate the symbolism of Yod is by way of its association with the Decad (i.e., the number 10). The notation of the number 10 perfectly captures its intent: as comprised of I and 0, it is a unity formed through multiplicity. It acts as both an ending and a beginning. It is both old and new at once. It exists at a perfect point of balance, poised between two worlds. Linguistically, Yod bears an uncanny resemblance in sound to its notation in number. The letter "y" is technically classified by modern linguistics as a *palatal approximant*. This describes the fact that the letter is sounded by partially restricting the air flow with the center of the tongue raised close to the palate. Unlike a



Editorial

"Between stimulus and response there is a space. In that space is our power to choose our response. In our response lies our growth and our freedom."

- Viktor Frankl

iktor Frankl, Austrian neurologist, psychiatrist and Holocaust survivor was among the rare individuals who could find meaning in life even among the extreme suffering and dehumanizing conditions of the Nazi concentration camps. Frankl believed that most individuals strive to find meaning in life, and that it is this sense of purpose that enables people to overcome the profoundly painful life experiences.

Struggle is not unique to human experience. The Brotherhood of Light Lessons stress that every lifeform on earth, from the tiniest bacteria to the immense blue whale, struggles to survive. One of the struggles faced by every lifeform is to find enough sustenance to stay alive. In the world of eat or be eaten, another struggle is to avoid becoming the next meal of another lifeform. An additional challenge is to pass on one's DNA so that the species continues to thrive.

For most living creatures, it is the environment that determines whether or not the species thrives, merely survives, or goes extinct. Among environmental factors, weather and climate have the greatest impact on life. Extremes of temperature, along with too much or too little water, are determining factors in survival. Nevertheless, plants, animals and microbes have developed survival strategies in such unlikely places as Death Valley, the Arctic Circle, and even volcanic vents in the Mid-Atlantic. This surge of life in its infinite forms continues to figure out ways to survive and even thrive in the harshest of environments.

Migratory animals have found solutions for adequate nutrition by always being on the move in search of greener pastures. However, the preponderance of bleached skulls in the American West indicates that some animals are not always successful in making it to the next waterhole or patch of grass before they expire. Around 66-million years ago there was an impact event that brought about the end of the Cretaceous Period, the result of a deep-space object colliding with earth. Some small hardy species survived this event, but life on earth has never looked quite the same as it was prior to impact. These surviving species were able to overcome the obstacles to their existence by adapting to a changing environment.

For much of our history, we humans have been migratory nomads, hunting and gathering seasonally. Over the last 10,000 years we became sedentary herders and farmers, growing and raising what we needed for our nourishment in an attempt to outsmart the vicissitudes of nature. As a species we have made efforts to eradicate hunger, nevertheless, food insecurity is still a reality. Some 795 million people in the world (about one in nine) do not have enough food.

The Semi-sextile Aspect

Measurement

Semi-sextile, 30° Zodiacal Longitude

The Semi-sextile is formed when two planets are one sign or 30 degrees apart. They are usually found near the same degree of adjoining signs. The Semi-Sextile is a weak aspect with a very narrow orb that ranges from I degree for planets in a Cadent House (3, 6, 9 & 12) to 4 degrees for a Luminary (Sun or Moon) in an Angular House (1, 4, 7 & 10). The waves of astral energy that are radiated by planets in a Semi-sextile aspect blend mildly and compatibly with one another. The Semi -sextile and Inconjunct aspects are the two weakest aspects measured in Hermetic Astrology.

Keyword

The keyword for the Semi-sextile is Growth. The areas of the chart where two planets are engaged in a Semi-sextile are mildly harmonious attracting small, positive advantages. In Natal Astrology, these are often areas where an individual may not display outstanding ability but more hidden traits which through effort and initiative are developed.

Planetary Comparison

The Semi-sextile is comparable to the qualities of the Moon, inasmuch as it brings gentle growth and nurturing to the two planets found 30° apart.

Application

The Semi-sextile is mildly-harmonious; neither signifies special talents nor does it bring rewards without exertion. The individual must cultivate effort, initiative and persistence to achieve full expression of the energies of the two planets engaged in this aspect.

our country, while poverty is certainly still an issue, many of us are at least fortunate enough to have the choice to grow into a spiritual life.

Growth implies movement forward; if we are going backward it is the opposite of growth; it is decline. This is important in our discussion of the semi-sextile as it explains Zain's definition that a semi-sextile is comparable to the Moon. The Moon is nurturing and caring; the very characteristics which must be present for growth. His comparison to the lunar energies confirms that growth will only occur with specific attention directed toward progressive development.

The next reference in Zain's definition is that the semisextile is mildly harmonious. As we compute our astrodynes, a semi-sextile has one-quarter of its power as harmony, which means then that three-quarters of the aspect's power is neutral. Keep in mind here that if the planets involved are discordant or harmonious, this creates another dynamic to add to the mix.

Our task once again here is to determine how we can use this aspect to further our spiritual growth. Assuming we have all learned the basics of astrology, we can concur that a semi-sextile is portrayed as a mostly minor aspect. It does not carry the power of a conjunction or opposition in any case; however, in terms of eternal progression, simply through nurturing this growth we may create a more powerful use of our energies!

A semi-sextile brings two or more celestial energies together which are 30 degrees apart. Semi-sextiles can occur with planets* at the end and beginning of the same sign because a semi-sextile has a small orb of influence, but often the semi-sextile will occur in adjacent signs. As discussed, the semi-sextile is a slightly harmonious aspect in itself, but we remember that additional harmony or discord for the aspect will be added depending on the harmony, discord, or neutral natures of the planets involved. As the planets and luminaries travel 30 degrees apart, we must consider each planet as having its own personality as it comes into contact with the other(s) in the semi-sextile. A semi-sextile creates GROWTH for all those traits signified by the planets involved, their sign, and their position in the horoscope.

consonant, however, the airflow is never completely obstructed. Hence, it cannot be called a true consonant. On the other hand, air is not allowed to flow freely as in the case of a true vowel. For this reason, "y" acts as either a vowel or consonant in language, depending on its position and use, a function which has earned it the epithet "semi-vowel".

While this is not always the case, the modern classification of the letter "y" concurs with that of the ancient Kabbalists. They also classified this letter as a *palatal*, indicating its point of formation. Recall that the Kabbalists define five points of articulation in the mouth: guttural, palatal, lingual, dental, and labial. The deepest points of articulation appear to coincide with letters that describe the spiritual world (as unseen and hidden), while the more obvious points of articulation correspond to the material word (as manifest and overt). As a palatal, Yod acts as a bridge between the spiritual and material, while still reminding us of its primarily spiritual origins through its closer


proximity to the deepest recesses of the vocal tract.

Interestingly, if you slow down the phonation of the letter "y," you will discover that it is actually a glide of two distinct vowel sounds: "e" and "a". Recall that "a", as the first letter of the AB, is the phonic representation of the Monad. Here again, we are reminded of the Decad's implicit link to Unity. On the other hand, whereas Aleph represented a pure and initiating Unity, Yod represents a Unity born through Multiplicity and thereby bears a sec-

Whatever its sound symbolism, it is clear that through its position as a pivot point between single and compound numbers, the tenth letter, Yod, acts as a bridge between that which has been and that which wishes to be. It stands at the boundary between past and future, and in this sense, represents the infinite present, in which all manifestation and manner of action exists.


Interpretive Notes

In the Hermetic System, the tarot represents a synthesis of the universe based on astrological symbolism.

"The Horsemen do not represent people, but thoughts or unseen intelligences. As thoughts are ruled by Arcanum I, each Horseman has a numerical value of I. In divination they are read as thoughts or intelligences that have an influence upon the life of the client. The one who thinks the thoughts is indicated by the Court Card nearest whom the Horseman is found in the spread."

Tarot Spread Interpretation

The question was asked, "Will my appeal to the County Accessor's Office to lower my property taxes be successful?"

Card Spread

The Distant Past: Seven of Cups (reversed). "The divinatory significance of the Seven of Cups is a successful change of home; its inner interpretation is VERITY."

The Recent Past: Trey of Scepters (reversed). "The divinatory significance of the Trey of Scepters is a business partnership; its inner interpretation is PROPAGANDA."

The querent, faced with rising property taxes, asked the question, "Will my appeal to lower my property taxes be successful?" He retained property tax consultants whom he had successfully used in the past to appeal his recent tax hike.

The Distant Past: Seven of Cups (reversed) reveals that the property owners move to this home eleven years ago was a successful one.

The Recent Past: The Trey of Scepters (reversed) denotes that the querent recently retained a consultant whom he had previously used to appeal the current tax assessment.

The Present: King of Scepters indicates a fiery, headstrong, ambitious, and energetic man who has a powerful influence over the direction of this question. This might identify the consultant, or more likely the accessor who was sent out by the County to measure the property.

The Near Future: Arcanum XII—The Martyr (reversed) usually attracts loss and sacrifice.

The Distant Future: Four of Coins (reversed) normally shows money received through a partner. In this case, if we consider the 8th House nature of the card, it is money paid out on a tax bill.

The Present: King of Scepters. "The King of Scepters signifies a person ruled by the sign Aries: fiery, headstrong, ambitious, courageous and energetic. Right way up it denotes an Aries man; reversed it indicates an Aries woman. The dominant idea is I AM."

The Near Future: Arcanum XII—The Martyr (reversed). "In Divination, Arcanum XII may be read as Sacrifice or Explation."

The Distant Future: Four of Coins (reversed). "The divinatory significance of the Four of Coins is money received through a partner; its inner significance is ORIGINALITY."

Summary

Summary

The "Yes or No" spread has five cards that are dealt in a row from right to left. The middle card is valued at 2 points, and the other cards each have the value of I point. A majority of the cards right side up indicate a yes answer, or if the majority of the cards are reversed, as in the case of this reading, it is a no answer.

The presence of two Scepters (trey of Scepters and King of Scepters) shows the fiery business nature of the question. The Seven of Cups might reveal the affection that the owner has for his property which is in a garden-like setting. Having undergone repeated increases in his tax bill, he retained a property tax consultant represented by the Trey of Scepters, to appeal the current tax assessment. The County sent out an accessor pictured by the King of Scepters to inspect the property. Arcanum XII, The Martyr (reversed) shows that appeal was denied, and the Four of Coins (reversed), promises future increases, though in small increments.

For the majority of the world who have solved the issue of hunger, there are any number of areas where the modern human struggles. In developed nations our struggles are no longer just about food and environment. We may struggle to secure a job, keep a job, or to make enough money through our job to cover our expenses.

Health is another area of great concern for most people. If you have a physical body, then there is a good chance in the course of your lifetime you will have problems with that body. Death Certificates never list radiant, vital health as the cause of death. From our head to our toes, there is a lot of territory where something can go wrong. Although during the last century there have been great advances in medicine, the world's populations do not all have equal access to health care. This is why the life expectancy in the European principality of Monaco is 89.57 years, while in the African nation of Chad it is 49.44 years; another example of how environment impacts survival.

In the 40 years I have conducted spiritual counseling with clients, it has been clear that human relationships are one of the greatest areas of conflict for the majority of individuals. Chances are, if you have other human beings in your life, be it parents, children, siblings, spouses, friends, neighbors, schoolmates, colleagues, coworkers, bosses or subordinates, you also have the challenges and misunderstandings that come from being human. Few areas of life provide such fertile ground for our personal growth as do our human relationships.

According to The Brotherhood of Light Lessons, each one of our life challenges also provides an opportunity

for personal growth. Each time we successfully meet and overcome any obstacle in our lives, we grow in skill and ability. The Source of All Life wants us to grow in love and wisdom and discover our place in the Divine Plan. It is up to each one of us, even amidst the darkness of our personal struggles, to find the meaning and the purpose of our lives.
